## REInspired

In February and March we have delivered 15 sessions to around 700 primary school pupils. And we have a further 5 sessions booked in after the Easter holidays. What a privilege it is to be able to have such a good relationship with our local schools and have this opportunity to share our faith with so many pupils. Some of the highlights this term have included:

- welcoming a couple of new volunteers to the team and working with our fabulous ecumenical REInspired team
- a 10-year-old's summary at the end of our session on 'what does the Easter story teach us about life after death?' describing that he'd learnt how we might feel sad when someone dies but that we can also feel hopeful because we might see that person again in heaven one day
- a girl's confident response to my statement that Jesus is now in heaven: "well, actually, he's also everywhere and wherever we go"
- hearing year 4 children share their postcards about Easter traditions around the world (a new session that we wrote and trialled for the first time)
- year 2s curious questions engaging with their topic: 'why does the Easter story bring hope to Christians?'

Do consider whether you might be interested in helping with one or two school sessions each term. The commitment can be as much or as little each individual wishes. We would love to grow our team even more!

## Reading Elections Assembly

In the run-up to the local elections, Reading Citizens is bringing candidates from all the main parties into one room — and putting our priorities directly to them. This is a far more than a hustings; our Accountability Assembly is our moment to secure clear public commitments on the issues that matter most to our communities. These commitments will provide us with accountability and the ability to take action should the candidates be elected.

In the course of our work and latest listening campaign we have agreed two critical asks for those who are standing for office in our town.

1. **Homelessness and Housing:** That council ensure that all developers working in Reading currently and applying for permissions provide a minimum of 30% affordable housing in their developments.
2. **Safe Green Spaces:** That council implement a safety programme to remove unsafe, illegal, and antisocial activity from the parks in town. Creating safe places for all people, but particularly children, to connect with nature, play, and socialise without fear.

A packed room sends a powerful message: we are organised, we are united, and we expect action. We invite you to join us and bring others from your organisation.
